Photographer Lisa Levart is on a mission.

For over twenty five years, Lisa has traveled near and far from her Hudson Valley home to create iconic portraits that uncovers the spirit of independent girls, ferocious women, powerful warrior activists and epic elders.

Rooted in myths and sacred stories, her archetypal images weave together the personal and collective journeys of women's lives. Inspired by the collaborative process, her process makes space for personal agency, and the radical act of each woman declaring, "I am here. See me."

Levart's work has been exhibited widely— from galleries in NYC, to museums, and as site-specific installations. Her work is represented in the permanent collection of the 9/11 Memorial Museum in NYC, and was recognized by the Julia Margaret Cameron Award's for Women Photographers, a Larry Salley Photography Award and a Brigit Award from the Association for the Study of Women and Mythology.

Her first book, "Goddess on Earth: Portraits of the Divine Feminine", won a Gold Nautilus Book Award and was named one of the 100 Best New Women's Spirituality Books by the California Institute of Integral Studies, and "Goddess on Earth Oracle, A Divination Deck and Guidebook With Spirited Wisdom From Your Sisters" won a Nautilus Book Award in 2021.
